What are the Impacts of Restorative Justice?

- · Reduction of crime and re-offending.
- Restorative Justice is six times more cost effective than court proceedings
- Identifies and addresses underlying causes of crime
- All parties receive resources and supports that provide a sense of belonging and help create a safer community
- Provides a safe environment for the victim to speak about the harm done and a way for the person who caused the harm to make amends
- Restorative Justice transforms fear, shame and hurt into a sense of safety, closure and healing
